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## **NDIS Evidence Advisory Committee**



The Australian Government is setting up the NDIS Evidence **Advisory Committee**.

An Advisory Committee is a group of people who



- Go to meetings
- Help make decisions
- Come from different areas.

We call it the **EAC** for short.



The EAC will be made up of **experts**.

Experts are people who know a lot about something.



The EAC will start by July 2025.



They will have meetings during the year.



They will tell the government about if different kinds of supports are

- Safe
- A good use of money.



You might pay for these with your NDIS **funding**.

Funding is **money from the government** to take part in the NDIS.

#### Why do we need the EAC

The government did a **review** of the NDIS.



A review is when you **check** what

- Works
- Needs to change.



They had some **recommendations** about what to do better with the NDIS.

Recommendations are ideas to do things better.



A recommendation was for the government to set up the EAC.

## What will the EAC do



There will be a plan for the EAC.

Lots of people in the government will help make this plan together.



The EAC will have some other groups help them.



These are called **sub committees**.



They will look at different NDIS supports people get.

The EAC will check that the supports are




• Good

• Health experts


They know a lot about keeping people healthy.
