#### Recommendations

- Agree that some in-kind will be required in full Scheme, on an exceptions basis for a limited time period.
- Agree the new agreement will include a section on in-kind arrangements, which includes supports
  that Victoria will be able to claim an in-kind offset for.
- Agree that further in-kind details, including the estimated number of NDIS participants who will
  access these supports, are required to assess the total in-kind offset value.
- Note the example clause at Attachment 3.3 A, consistent with the draft agreement shared to DRC.

#### **Background Summary**

- The Commonwealth is committed to phasing out in-kind contributions but accepts some in-kind will be required in full Scheme:
  - These in-kind arrangements will be agreed bilaterally and detailed in the new agreement, including a maximum cap on in-kind contributions, cash-out deadlines, and average unit values for each support.
  - o NDIA prices should be used, where possible.
  - The Commonwealth will seek a step down in total in-kind year on year, and the offset Victoria receives will be based on actual usage of the supports and supported by data that meets the NDIA's data requirements.
- The new agreement will specify cash out dates for all in-kind supports, with the exception of the education supports; as the future of the education supports in the context of the NDIS will be considered by the Ministerial Council.
- Further in-kind details could be included in the agreement or, if preferred by Victoria, in an annual exchange of letters between DSS and Victoria.

DSS noted that with the exception of the education supports, the Commonwealth's position is that all in-kind should be phased out by 30 June 2023, and that this is consistent with the full Scheme agreements signed to date. s47B
